

New Niles law taxes retail cable lines

Telecommunications company retailers operating in Niles will soon be paying another tax to do business in the village.

The Village Board passed an ordinance at the September board meeting enacting a 1% Telecommunications Infrastructure Maintenance Fee Tax on retailers of fiber optic or cable lines for the purpose of regulating their use of Niles public streets and rights-of-way.

Trustee Louella Preston pre-

sented the measure to the board stating that the ordinance had been developed to enable all municipalities to be consistent with one another regarding the collection of fees.

Prior to enactment of the Act, communities could impose individual franchise and license fees on retailers which varied from \$500 to 1% of their gross revenues a year for the use of their public streets and rights-of-way.

Ex-school official charged with embezzling

Friends and associates are registering shock and concern as the tale of the alleged embezzlement of half a million dollars by a former board member of Skokie School District 73-1/2 is being unfolded.

Park Ridge and Skokie police arrested Sharon Wiseman, 46, at her Skokie home Sept. 23, charging her with four felonies: two counts of forgery and two counts of theft.

Free on \$10,000 bond, Wiseman is being electronically monitored. Earlier in the week, Wiseman commented to Larry

Herzog, Park Ridge Deputy Police Chief, that she has a real need to shop.

Wiseman, part owner of Wiseman and Cohen Numbers, Inc., a Skokie accounting firm, allegedly embezzled \$500,000 from Richard Smith International, a Park Ridge import-export company by entering checks as if they were being paid out to various companies but then writing the checks to herself. She signed Richard Smith's name and deposited 95 checks into her own account, according to officials.

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) is offering a new pilot program to residents of SWANCC communities. On every Saturday from October 4, 1997 through November 22, 1997, from 6 a.m. until noon, individuals can bring their residential construction debris and other residential refuse to the Wheeling Township Transfer Station in Glenview. This SWANCC program will in no way effect the Village of Niles current refuse

program. This program was brought about as SWANCC was receiving calls from area residents inquiring about bringing waste directly to the Transfer Station. Residents who utilize this program will be required to unload their own vehicle at the site. The fee structure is as follows: 1/2 ton of material or less is \$25 and \$50 per ton for more than 1/2 ton of material. There will also be a \$3 charge for each tire brought to the

Edward Jones: Sometimes You Can Make Money With Dogs

The stock market is not a horse race.

Nevertheless, each new day brings another stock "jockey" proclaiming a fool-proof new "system" to beat the odds. History has shown, however, that the best system for success is a long-term buy-and-hold strategy.

Even so, there are a few methods of stock investing that have proved to be effective. Some of those methods deal with the Dow Jones Industrial Average. The Dow is a price-weighted average of 30 actively traded blue-chip stocks. Together they represent between 15 percent and 20 percent of the market value of all stocks trading on the New York Stock Exchange—hardly a bunch

of dogs. Yet several interesting techniques concentrate on Dow stocks that are out of favor—the "Dogs of the Dow."

One of the main proponents of the Dow dogs is John Downes, co-author of the book "Beating the Dow" and editor of a newsletter by the same name. One of Downes' strategies, called the "Dow Ten," calls for buying equal amounts of the 10 highest-yielding Dow stocks. A high-yield often means the price of the stock has dropped, making the dividend high in relation to the stock price.

Another strategy, the "Flying Five," concentrates on the five lowest-priced stocks of the Dow Ten. Each year, the portfolio is

adjusted to include the latest high yielders. (Remember, however, that there are tax ramifications every time you sell a stock.)

Downes also offers a one-stock strategy, the Penultimate (next-to-last) Profit Prospect, or PPP. This involves simply buying the Dow Ten stock with the second-lowest price, keeping it for a year and then trading it for that year's new PPP. (Again, keep in mind the tax ramifications.)

The PPP theory has more risk than either the Dow Ten or Flying Five strategies due to its lack of diversification. In effect, you're putting all of your eggs in one basket.

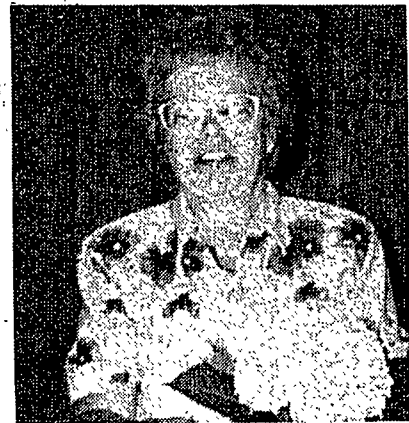

CHOLESTEROL SCREENING
Cholesterol is a soft, fat-like substance found in every cell in the body. Most of the body's cholesterol is made in the liver, the rest comes from animal fat in foods. Egg yolks, meat, poultry and dairy products all contain cholesterol. Everyone needs some cholesterol, but not too much. Eating foods low in animal fat is one of the best ways to lower cholesterol. Cholesterol screenings will be offered from 9 to 11 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 7 in the Morton Grove Village Hall Senior Center. The quick and simple test will give an accurate total blood cholesterol measurement in just three minutes. For Morton Grove seniors (age 65+) there is a charge of \$3. For those under 65 or for non-residents the charge is \$4.

FLU & PNEUMONIA IMMUNIZATIONS
The Village of Morton Grove will provide influenza and pneumonia immunizations for residents over age 60. The cost of the shots are free for those whose primary insurance is Medicare Part B. Patients who are enrolled in an HMO or who do not subscribe to Medicare Part B must pay \$10 for the flu shot and \$15 for the pneumonia shot.

Influenza immunizations provide immunity to the most commonly predicted flu strains for this winter. Seniors should get a flu shot each year. Pneumonia immunizations provide lifelong immunity to the most common forms of pneumonia. People who have already received this immunization do not need another one. You should not be immunized if you are:

- 1) allergic to chicken, chicken feathers or eggs,
- 2) on a prescription blood thinner (coumadin, warfarin, panwarfarin, etc.),
- 3) allergic to thimerosal (mercurial antiseptic) or aminoglycosides (gentamicin, kanamycin or neomycin),
- 4) someone who has ever suffered from the illness known as Guillain-Barre Syndrome, or
- 5) someone who has cold symptoms the day of their shot.

Shots will be administered in a "needle-free" system by the Visiting Nurse Association North. Those interested in a shot on the dates below must make a reservation by calling the Senior Hot Line at 470-5223.

Dudycz to sponsor property tax assessment meeting

State Sen. Walter Dudycz (R-7th, Chicago) is sponsoring a public hearing on October 7 for 7th District residents who have questions about their property tax assessments.

The meeting is scheduled from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. at Olympia Park, 6566 N. Avondale in Chicago.

"A property owner's tax bill is determined in large part by the value placed on the property. It is important to know when and how to challenge these assessments," Dudycz said. "I have asked representatives from the Cook County Board of Appeals and Illinois Property Tax Appeal Board to attend this public hearing to answer questions."

The 7th District Senator says the hearing will also help provide information about the newly expanded rights of Cook County citizens to appeal their tax bills to

the Property Tax Appeal Board. Previously, in Cook County, the only recourse after the county's Board of Appeals was Circuit Court, which requires a higher burden of proof and legal costs for the taxpayer.

The new law also establishes "clear and convincing" as the burden of proof of a taxpayer must meet in court to prevail in an assessment challenge. This burden of proof is more favorable to taxpayers than the doctrine of "constructive fraud," which was abolished as part of the legislation.

Exploring Niles' History:

Did your grandfather's grandfather attend Jefferson Township High School?

Each Illinois township, according to an Illinois law passed in 1857, could establish one high school. The first high school attended by Niles residents was Jefferson Park Township High School built in 1869.

The school opened in May 1870 above a police station at Irving Park, Cicero, and Milwaukee Avenues. In 1883 it moved to a site at 4626 N. Knox near the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad station at Montrose.

Early records of Jefferson Township High School are still maintained today by its successor Schurz High School. The names of early Niles residents, particularly the Ebingers, are still on school records indicating they attended Jefferson Township High School.

Rapid population growth in Maine Township led to the establishment of Maine Township High School in 1901. Dr. C.A.

Earle headed the first school board.

A site was purchased at 1557 Thacker Road in Des Plaines. Construction of the high school began in 1902. A \$15,000 bond issue covered costs.

The school opened in November 1902 with 35 students who had been meeting in a Park Ridge elementary school since the beginning of the school year. By the end of the school year, there were 50 students in the school. W.L. Smyser was the principal.

Earling Lundie, a 1910 graduate, wrote in the Park Ridge Herald that the school was the first to organize a suburban high school baseball league. He was the captain of the team, practicing in an unheated hall of a saloon keeper.

His courses of study included spelling, grammar, rhetoric, literature classics, commercial arithmetic, algebra and solid geometry, Latin (2-1/2 years),

German (2 years), history (2 years), physiology, psychology, penmanship and music.

Lundie received a scholarship to the University of Chicago but could not attend until he completed courses in physics and chemistry which were not taught at Maine Township High School. A \$55,000 addition, with an auditorium, gymnasium, and "swimming tank," was built in 1915 for the 185 students at the school.

Maine Township was the first school in Illinois to teach telegraphy and automobile repair. A hole was chipped in the school's two-foot-thick walls so cars could be driven in to be repaired.

An instructor, who did not know how to drive, worked with students in repairing the cars.

In 1927 Maine Township High School was in danger of losing its North Central Association accreditation. The building was judged to be inadequate and overcrowded.

A new \$650,000 high school building at Dempster and Potter Road was made available to Maine Township High School in March 1930. Later this school would be called Maine East High School. Today most students of high school age in Niles attend Maine East.

The Niles Historical Museum is collecting photos, written materials, and all historic items which provide an insight into how Niles developed during its existence. The village will be 100 years old in 1999. However, settlers were in the area since the 1830s. Should you have any items relating to the history of Niles, do call the Niles Historical Museum about making arrangements to deliver items. Should

the item have sentimental or personal value, please consider loaning it to the museum for the centennial year. The museum is located at 8970 N. Milwaukee Avenue. It is open Wednesday and Friday from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. You may also call (847) 390-0160 for further information.

Illinois Insurance Hotline

Q. My health insurance is through an HMO group plan. I just found out my doctor is starting his own practice and will not be part of the HMO. I don't want to find a new doctor. What are my options?

A. Your options are: (1) Find another primary-care physician within the network; (2) If appropriate, designate a women's health care provider within the network to coordinate your health care; or (3) Continue with your doctor realizing there are no insurance benefits to cover the associated costs.

HMO's operate on the idea of managed care. An HMO is a network of doctors and hospitals who agree to a prearranged fee schedule and to commit to the plan rules. As a policyholder, you agree to choose a primary-care physician within the HMO network to oversee and manage your health care. In addition, you must use hospitals within the HMO network and obtain a physician referral to see specialists.

In this case, your health insurance is an employee benefit, so you cannot change to another plan until the next benefit enrollment period. At that time look into an indemnity plan which will allow you to return to the care of your original doctor. Do your homework before you make the switch, though. Check out differences in benefits, claim processing, procedure preapproval, and premium costs.

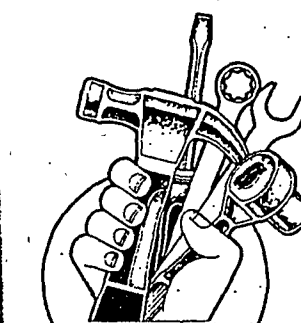

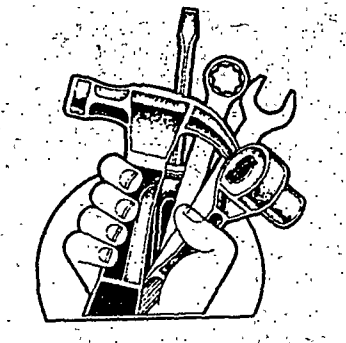

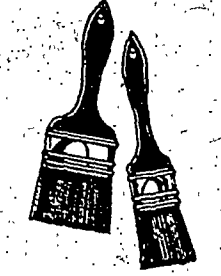

Auto batteries: Dangerous to eyes

Many car owners don't know what their car batteries look like, much less know how to jump-start one safely if it fails. This lack of knowledge causes many Americans to lose their sight or suffer serious eye injuries each year in auto battery accidents.

"People may not know enough about the basic mechanics of a car," says Maurice F. Rabb, M.D., medical director of Prevent Blindness America. "As long as their cars start, motorists often don't worry about the vehicle's battery. That can be dangerous."

All vehicle batteries contain sulfuric acid and produce hydrogen and oxygen gases. Improper jump-starting procedures may turn an auto battery into a bomb. "If the gases come into contact with a spark, flame or lit cigarette, the battery can explode, sending battery fragments and acid flying," notes Dr. Rabb. Every year, dead batteries keep millions of cars from starting - and it never happens at a convenient time or place. Motorists should be aware of basic car mechanics and jump-start procedures before they find themselves stranded.

"Knowing how to properly jump-start a dead battery reduces the chance of an explosion," says Tod Turfitt, safety director of Prevent Blindness America. Prevent Blindness America advises motorists to take a few moments to read through their car owner's manual and familiarize themselves with the basic mechanics of their vehicle. "Many cars are now equipped with sophisticated computer systems," says Dr. Rabb. "Jump-starting the car improperly may also fry the system."

Prevent Blindness America advises motorists to prepare for battery failure by having an emergency jump-start kit in their cars. The kit should include splash-proof safety goggles, jumper cables, a flashlight and jump-start instructions.

Motorists should also have an emergency plan in mind if their disabled car's battery explodes. "Most people panic if battery acid splashes into their eyes," notes Dr. Rabb. "The first thing the injured motorist should do is flush the eye with the first 'drinkable' liquid they find: water, milk, juice or a soft drink. Every second counts; the longer the acid sits in the eyes, the greater the chances of a serious corneal burn of blindness."

Prevent Blindness America advises all motorists to be prepared and offers a free jump-start instruction sticker that can be stored in the vehicle. Motorists can obtain the free jump-start sticker by calling Prevent Blindness America at 1 (800) 331-2020.

Brookfield Zoo has two recent additions to its animal collection - a Grevy's zebra foal and a giraffe calf.

The Grevy's zebra foal named Farasi, which means "horse" in

Swahili, was born at Brookfield Zoo on July 6, and can be seen with her mother outdoors in an enclosure southwest of the Habitat Africa! exhibit.

The foal is the fifth born to Marie, a 20-year-old on loan from Dallas Zoo, Texas, and her mate, Marwell, a 15-year-old on loan from Marwell Zoological Park, Winchester, England. This is the seventeenth Grevy's zebra born at Brookfield Zoo.

Grevy's zebra births are significant because man has pushed this species to the brink of extinction. It is estimated that only several thousand Grevy's zebra exist in the wild. Grevy's zebra compete for habitat with increasing number of domestic livestock and contend with water shortages due to irrigation projects created for agriculture and livestock. They also have been hunted for their skin.

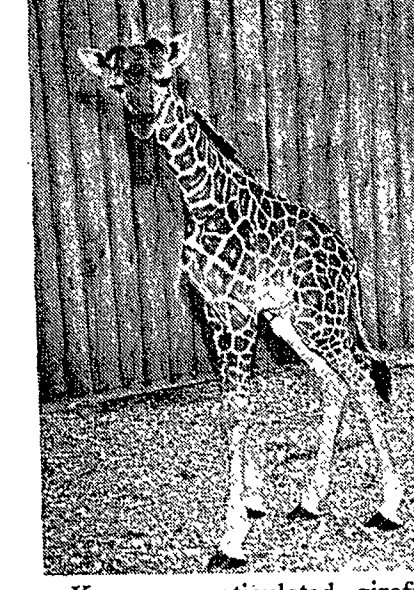
To help ensure the survival of this species, Brookfield Zoo is one of 36 North American zoos to cooperatively manage more than

180 Grevy's zebra through a Species Survival Plan (SSP) coordinated by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association. Through this plan, zoos strive to protect the Grevy's zebra from extinction through long-term captive breeding. Grevy's zebra are one of 32 SSP species managed at Brookfield Zoo. Ann Peritt, one of Brookfield Zoo's mammal curators, is a member of the Species Survival Plan management group for Grevy's zebra.

In addition, Brookfield Zoo's reticulated giraffe, Carol, gave birth to her eighth offspring on July 16. At birth, the male calf, named Kenya, measured just under 6 feet tall and weighed 130 pounds. Carol is 24 years old and was also born at Brookfield Zoo. The father is Lukoro, 15. Both mother and calf have access to the inside enclosure area at the zoo's Habitat Africa! exhibit which is home to six giraffes.

The giraffe is the world's tallest animal. Adult males may grow to heights of 18 feet, and

adult females may stand taller than 14 feet. The species has an elongated neck, with a short, erect mane, long legs, high shoulders, and sloping hindquarters. The tail ends in a long tuft. Both

sexes have horns covered with hide. Reticulated giraffes have a white coat with brown to chestnut blotches of various shapes and sizes. The animals' underparts are generally light and unspotted.

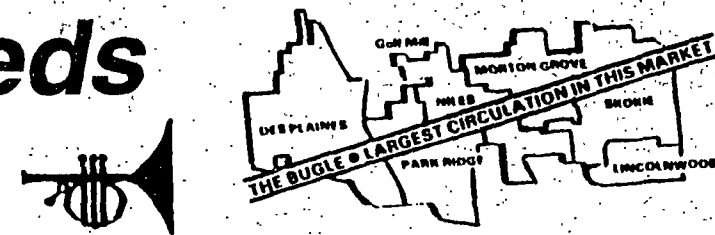
Reticulated giraffes are common in the wild. They share their natural habitat, northeastern Kenya, with the Grevy's zebra. Open every day of the year, Brookfield Zoo is located at First Avenue and 31st Street in Brookfield, Ill., and is accessible via the Stevenson (I-55) and Eisenhower (I-290) expressways, Tri-State Tollway (I-294), Burlington-Northern Commuter line, and PACE bus service.

Know When to Go: React Fast to Fire

It's a fact...60% of all fire-related deaths in the state of Illinois happen in the Chicago land area. The Red Cross recommends following these easy prevention tips so that you won't be a statistic!

- Smoke detectors save lives! Install a battery-operated smoke detector on each level of your home, outside each sleeping area and in the garage. Check the batteries in your detectors every six months and replace batteries immediately if needed.
- Create a home fire escape plan. Draw a floor plan of your home and plan your escape route. Designate a meeting place outside for family members to report to once safely out of the home. Practice your escape plan with your entire family at least twice a year.
- Sleep with bedroom doors closed. By sleeping with bedroom doors closed, you create a barrier for the fire and keep it from reaching you.
- Roll out of bed and crawl under smoke. If a fire starts when you're sleeping, roll out of bed rather than stand up. Crawl low under smoke, keeping your head 12-24 inches off the floor. Crawling along a wall will help you stay on track.
- Do not hide in a burning building. Children under the age of five made up 22 percent of the fire deaths in Illinois last year. Because they are frightened of smoke and fire, children often hide in closets or under furniture rather than getting out of the building. Everyone in a burning home should get out of the building immediately.
- Know two ways out. Make sure you identify two ways out of every room of your house.
- Feel all doors. Feel all doors with the back of your hand before opening. If the door is hot, do not open it and use your second escape route. Close all doors behind you to keep the fire from reaching you.
- Get out and stay out! Never go back into a burning building. If you think someone is trapped in the fire, immediately inform the firemen on the scene. Fire fighters are specially trained to safely perform rescues.
- Call 9-1-1. Once you are out of the house, call 9-1-1 or your local emergency response number from a neighbor's home or pay phone. Do not call for help while you are in the burning building.
- Practice your fire escape plan. Practice your escape plan with your entire family at least twice a year.

These franchise fees were currently paid by the telecommunications consumer.

The new ordinance, drafted by the Telecommunications Subcommittee of the IML's Home Rule Attorney's Committee, and permissible under the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, requires all retailers, (those engaged in the business of making sales of telecommunications are retail) would come under the tax.

Franchise retailers will now be precluded from entering into these franchise agreements and paying negotiated fees for the use of the streets, roadways and rights-of-way.

Following the effective date of this ordinance January 1, 1998, all former franchise fees imposed on telecommunications companies will be phased out.

Preston also stressed that the tax does not affect cellular telephone towers or private property, nor the collection of other taxes or fees otherwise existing.

She further stated that the need for passage of the ordinance was imperative to enable the Village to provide all telecommunication companies with proper notice of the tax. Beginning on September 23, all those doing business in Niles will receive 90-day notice of this taxing measure.

In another matter, the Village Board paid tribute to the late Dorothy Dollack, former Commissioner of the Niles Plan Commission and Zoning Board. Mrs. Dollack had served the Zoning Board for 9 years prior to her retirement in July. She passed away on September 18.

Wiseman began working for the Smith firm as an independent contractor in April of 1992. She allegedly began altering checks and forging her employer's name in 1994, Park Ridge police said.

The police investigation began in June. Wiseman abruptly resigned from her school board position in July saying that she wanted to spend more time with her family, according to John Pelissero, school board president. Wiseman, the foster parent of several children over the past few years, had been a member of the district's finance committee since 1989.

Pelissero told the Sun-Times that he and other board members found it difficult to believe that Wiseman could be involved in the alleged embezzlement and were hoping that the allegations were not true.

The school district's funds, are handled by a business manager and can not be affected by Wiseman or any other board member. School board members do not have access to the district's funds, Pelissero said.

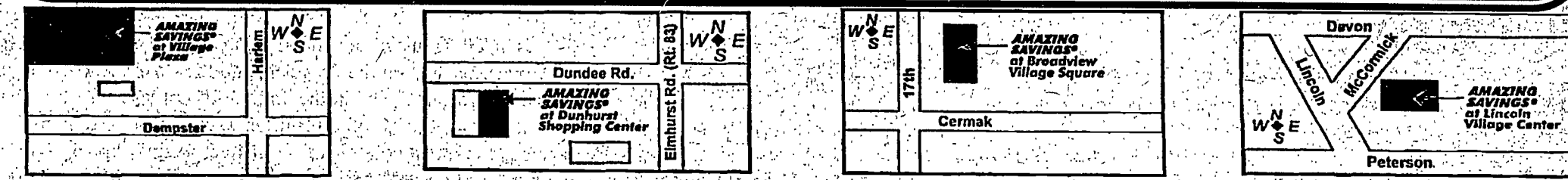
