Blase retires amid corruption charges

Same day, Niles mayor's federal trial date canceled

Niles Mayor Nicholas Blase, 80, retired Monday after nearly 50 years in office and under the shadow of federal corruption charges. Blase bid farewell to

well-wishers at a Village Hall send-off Monday morning - the same day Pioneer Press learned that Blase's Sept. 8 trial date had been stricken and reset for a status hearing on Sept. 11. Prosecutors would not say if the change was indicative of a plea bargain.

"The trial has been stricken," said Randall Sandborn, from the office of U.S. federal prosecutor Patrick Fitzgerald, "There will be a status hearing. and I have no comment on anything else."

When asked Monday

by Pioneer Press about his upcoming federal trial, Blase simply said, "The lawyers are going to have to sort that one out."

Several attorneys representing Blase could not be reached for comment.

With Blase's resignation effective at 5 p.m. Monday, officials expected that the Village Board at

its Tuesday meeting would elect Trustee Robert Callero to be interim mayor. Trustees Joe LoVerde and Andrew Przybylo both expressed interest in running for Blase's seat but said it was too early to make any formal announcements.

Federal agents arrested Blase at his home

in 2006 and accused him of using his office to steer local business owners to purchase insurance through an agency that allegedly paid him \$420,000 in kickbacks from the revenue it collected. He has pleaded not guilty.

Blase did not mention the indictment in a

farewell letter he issued

over the weekend to Niles residents but wrote that he plans to remain involved in village politics and pledged to make an endorsement in the next mayoral race.

"I am tired," he wrote. "I am retiring early so a mayor candidate can start campaigning now without the question, 'Is Mayor Blase going to run again.

... I am going to stay in Niles - get involved in the next mayor campaign My only problem is having something to do after 47 years of being mayor."

Blase was moved to tears at his going-away party, and thanked friends and family for their show of support.

"I've had a great run." he said. "I feel like after 47 vears it's time to leave. I'm going to miss this. It's been so important and such a huge part of my

In addition to being mayor, Blase spent nearly 30 years as Maine Town-

Mayor's departure sets off search for replacement

Sea change came to Niles politics Monday as Mayor Nicholas Blase resigned after 47 years in office, as he prepares to go to trial on federal corruption charges.

The board was expected to elect Trustee Robert Callero as interim mayor at its meeting Tuesday.

Blase, 80, has pledged to endorse a candidate soon. Meanwhile, rumors were cropping up Monday about who will run for mayor.

Trustee Andrew Przybylo, who succeeded Blase as Maine Township Democratic Committeeman several years



Blase retires amid corruption charges

Same day, Niles mayor's federal trial date canceled





Niles Mayor Nicholas Blase, 80, retired Mondav after nearly 50 years in office and under the shadow of federal corruption charges

Blase bid farewell to well-wishers at a Village Hall send-off Monday morning — the same day Pioneer Press learned that Blase's Sept. 8 trial date had been stricken and reset for a status hearing on Sept. 11. Prosecutors would not say if the change was indicative of a plea bargain.

"The trial has been stricken," said Randall Sandborn, from the office of U.S. federal prosecutor Patrick Fitzgerald. "There will be a status hearing, and I have no comment on anything else."

When asked Monday

by Pioneer Press about his its Tuesday meeting upcoming federal trial, Blase simply said, "The lawyers are going to have to sort that one out."

Several attorneys representing Blase could not be reached for comment. With Blase's resigna-

tion effective at 5 p.m. Monday, officials expected that the Village Board at

would elect Trustee Robert Callero to be interim mayor. Trustees Joe LoVerde and Andrew Przybylo both expressed interest in running for Blase's seat but said it was too early to make any formal announcements.

Federal agents arrested Blase at his home

in 2006 and accused him of using his office to steer local business owners to purchase insurance through an agency that allegedly paid him \$420,000 in kickbacks from the revenue it collected. He has pleaded not guilty.

Blase did not mention the indictment in a farewell letter he issued

over the weekend to Nile residents but wrote that he plans to remain involved in village politics and pledged to make an endorsement in the next mayoral race.

"I am tired," he wrote "I am retiring early so a mayor candidate can start campaigning now without the question. 'Is Mayor Blase going to run again.

... I am going to stay in Niles — get involved in the next mayor campaign. My only problem is having something to do after 47 years of being mayor."

Blase was moved to tears at his going-away party, and thanked friends and family for their show of support.

"I've had a great run," he said. "I feel like after 47 years it's time to leave. I'm going to miss this. It's been so important and such a huge part of my life

Mayor's departure sets off search for replacement



Historical museum closed for remodeling

The Niles Historical Museum is closed for remodeling indefinitely, according to the staff.

The museum closed its doors earlier this summer for remodeling, and the staff had hoped to reopen some time in the fall. But they say they've hit a few kinks.

Walter Beusse, the museum's membership coordinator, said most of the museum's troubles stemmed from the installation of an elevator

"There's a lot of red tape," he said. "It's hard to say when we'll be open."

In the meantime, museum staff and volunteers will be viewing its latest donation: a 16 mm video reel called, "A Shopping Center Comes to Town." It is an in-depth documentary about the early Golf Mill Shopping Center,

which opened to the public in 1960.

Museum President Marge Berles said the video was mailed in from Texas by a woman named Mare Tate

"I don't really know who she is or why she had it," Berles said. "Her family, I'm sure, used to live here and moved."

There is a problem, however. The museum doesn't have a 16 mm video player. But Berles

said they would locate one and attempt to transfer the film to a DVD so it can be shown when the museum reopens.

Until then, the Niles Public Library has granted the museum space for an Oct. 12 lecture on the art work of Grandma Moses, presented by Ceci Wiselogel from 2 to 4 p.m.

Maine East teaching legend Paul Carlson, 73, dies

The world may remember Paul Carlson as the history teacher who taught U.S. Senator and former First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, but the alumni, students and faculty of Maine East High School will remember him as "Mr. Maine" for the half century he devoted to the school he loved. Carlson, 73, died Aug. 19 after a long battle against cancer.

Visitation was held Aug. 21 at Nelson Funeral Home, Talcott and Cumberland, Park Ridge.

The family has planned a private funeral but will welcome friends to a public memorial service at 3 p.m. Sept. 7 at the Presbyterian Church of Park Ridge, Delphia and Crescent.

Mr. Carlson is survived by his wife of 32 years. Nancy, and the family he loved: sons Thomas (Nancy) Patterson and Robert (Marcy) Patterson: grandchildren David, Adam, Katie, Leah and Caroline; his sisters Joyce Smith of Michigan and Phyllis Allman of Missouri; nieces and nephews. He was the son of the late Walter and Eunice Carlson, and a lifelong Park Ridge resident.

Mr. Carlson, a 1953 graduate of Maine High School, had earned his bachelor's degree at Mon-

He remembered everyone, down to what they had done in high school and afterwards, and their seating position in his classroom.

mouth College and masters' degrees at William and Mary and at Northwestern University. But when it came to choosing a place to teach, he wanted to come back to Maine. He spent two years teaching in the original Maine building - by then, used at Thacker Junior High in Des Plaines School District 62 - and the next 48 years in what is now Maine East, at Dempster Street and Potter Road in Park Ridge.

His teaching career at Maine is unequaled by any other faculty members. In his time, as a history buff, he helped to collect the history of the high school, from early graduates, from the now-departed teachers he had studied under and

worked with, and from his own experiences. He was an active part in celebrating the school and Maine High School District 207's 75th and 100th anniversaries.

Mr. Carlson also was one of the most vocal opponents of any plan to close or architecturally muddle the Maine East building. A proponent of maintaining traditions, he hosted a Cherry Pie Festi val each year for George Washington's birthday, to bring in speakers to inspire students, and was seriously concerned earlier this year when for the first time the Maine East graduation moved off site, away from the football

Maine High School District 207 granted him "teacher emeritus" status in September 2007. He was only the second person to be so honored, along with the late Alexander Harley, a long-time music teacher who founded the Tri-M music honor society. His contributions to

history also included helping to found the Des Plaines Historical Society, founding and serving as first president of the Park **Ridge Historical Society**, co-chairing Park Ridge's 1972-73 Centennial and





Fragmented farm life

A lot of that land is still in the family name, but only one of the eight siblings still lives there, Jeannette Jenkins, who suffers from paranoid schizophrenia. "I was drawn in because I was visiting my aunt and seeing the architecture and everything falling down around her was a very theatrical image," Annie said. "She is this amazing storyteller. She is a musician herself and almost speaks in verse. When she talked, it evokes this nostalgic, vibrant place."

Annie also listened to

stories told by her grandmother and her grandmother's other living siblings "and got pulled into this idea of a farm that existed only in memory and the fallibility of memory. All of their stories are inconsistent, and they are very committed to the details of their stories."

"The Jenkins Farm Project," features both the video images and voices of Annie's Aunt Jeannette and of her homeless Uncle Glenn, who is also a paranoid schizophrenic — although his illness prevents him from returning to the farm. "Those two have the

clearest memories of all of the siblings," Annie reported. "And really fond memories of their youth and the simplicity that was the farm to them."

No reserved seats

Audience members will be surprised to discover when they enter the theater that all the seats have been removed. They will physically move through the piece in which multiple things are happening simultaneously. "It's a dance theater piece, so movement is the primary vocabulary," Annie said. "But [the dancers] also speak and sing,

and a lot of the text and all of the monologues are word-for-word taken from interviews with [Jeannette and Glennl." There are also some Bible passages in the show "because religion was a strong component of their life," plus some Depression-era work songs

To create the piece, the dancers and musicians all went to North Carolina, and spent a week improvising. "Annie had a structure for the show and she had


themes that she wanted to explore," said Colby, a composer who earns most of his living singing at weddings and corporate events with his band, The Party Faithful.

The result is an hourlong show underscored throughout by music Colby jokingly calls "schizophrenic bluegrass. We wanted to create some dissonant sounds, because there are some themes of mental illness that run through the show. I think the music provides a nice tense undercurrent to this exploration of memory."

"There are multiple things happening at the same time, so each audience member will experience the piece differently based on where they choose to go, and what they choose to see up close," Annie said.


The titles are even chilling. One of a mangled motorcycle wedged under the rim of a car is called "Donor." Another of a flipped over, smashed vehicle is called "Kaddish." That is the Jewish prayer of mourning.

Paintings in the Cubanborn artist's "Wrecked" series will be on display in Oakton Community College's Koehnline Museum of Art in Des Plaines from Sept. 4 to Oct. 17.

Ask Sierra the best thing about being an artist and he'll tell vou, "The hours ---certainly not the money."

Artist paints car wrecks to evoke 'war' on the streets

Knows from experience

of Paul Sierra's paintings in this series, features a horrific car wreck set against a bucolic "My Summer Vacation." background.

come directly from the heart of the Chicago resi dent.

"I, like most people, had a small car accident; nothing that broke too many of my bones," Sierra reported. "But it seemed to me that it was so sudden. My mind was on something else or I was talking to the driver, and all of a sudden. 'Bang,' there it was. It could have been the end.

"We make our cars our second home: our phone, our music, little gadgets for a nice smell, the works. You mention it, we have it," Sierra continued. "We feel safe at home but the truth is we are not. It happens any moment, even when you are going to your mother-in-law's or a vacation in the most beautiful places. This brings me to one of my obsessions: How



easy to break is life."

Sierra compared car accidents to a war because there's no reasoning behind who becomes a fatali ty. "That is what life is all about for me," Sierra said, adding with a hearty laugh, "I'm a pessimist."

When Sierra started working on the series, he searched the Internet for images of car accidents, and the number of sites he found shocked him. He was also startled to discover, that, because cars are made out of plastic, after a

serious accident they no longer look like cars. "Sometimes, to have an image for a painting, I have to combine several photographs in order for it to appear that it's a car," the artist revealed.

Sierra never includes

dead bodies in his "Wrecked" paintings. "If] show the bodies, it becomes morbid and people would just zoom into that part of the tragedy. I want the viewer to say, 'That could be me.'"

Child at heart

A highly successful, fulltime artist. Sierra immigrated to the United States when he was 15 and earned a degree at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. He insists that he didn't grow up in Cuba, though. "I never grew up," Sierra ioked.

Sierra's works are in the permanent collections of such places as the Smithsonian's National Museum of American Art and the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago. He mentioned that he doesn't expect to ever sell any paintings in the "Wrecked" series. "I did these paintings for myself," he said.

The nine paintings in the series do have their fans. however, including Nathan Harpaz, manager and curator of the Koehnline Museum of Art.

"The subject matter is significant," Harpaz said. "People don't realize that people are getting killed in car accidents more than in war in the United States. It could be a very gross subject matter to feature, but there are no human figures, you just see the wreck. What's left over is a monument for the tragedy and usually in a very pastoral type of landscape. It creates a contrast between the tragedy and the beautiful environment where it happened."

Harpaz added, "I think also the fact that he didn't put in human figures creates kind of an emptiness that almost symbolizes

It's a great day for England and a very bad day to be the bar mitzvah boy.

That's the basic idea in director Paul Weiland's likable, but borderline oversentimental remembrance of his ill-fated coming-of-age celebration on July 30, 1966 - when England shocked the world by winning the World Cup.

It's probable that everyone has had a big day of some sort screwed up by cruel circumstance. I remember my mother

loading up a station wagon full of kids to celebrate my birthday at a drive-in theater only to have the whole thing fizzle when "The Ghost and Mr. Chicken" was rained out. And it's fair to say that I've never really recovered. But young Bernie Rubens (Weiland's fictionalized stand-in) thinks of his bar mitzvah as something more than a bigtime birthday celebration. Something more, even, than becoming a man in his faith. He sees it as his big chance to stand in the spotlight. After being shoved to the sidelines all his life, this will be the moment when his family, and the world in general, finally say, "Now, we see the dazzling, sophisticated,

are." In other words, the kid's setting himself up for some serious tsouris.

valuable person you really

Bernie (very nicely played by 16-year-old Gregg Sulkin in his movie debut) is an asthmatic kid with oversized teeth and big nerdy glasses, but he's got super-suave plans for his rapidly approaching bar mitzvah party. He's thinking of a gigantic ballroom at a four-star hotel, with pop star Frankie Vaughan for entertainment and the ultraviolentgangster Kray brothers working security. But two terrible threats are just beginning to take shape: England somehow advanced beyond the preliminary rounds in the World Cup and his father's small grocery is being overshadowed by a big chain supermarket No one takes the

chance that England might actually be competing in the final match seriously, at first, but his father's financial prospects



are a very real concern. Primarily because his mild-mannered, soft-spoken, perpetually worried dad (Eddie Marsan) isn't very good at business. He isn't very good at anything, as a matter of fact; he's just a sad, downtrodden, overmatched little guy who sends Bernie into an asthmatic fit every time he embarrasses himself. And as his income dwindles, so do Bernie's chances for the bar mitzvah of his dreams.

PINEAPPLE EXPRESS ***



"Vicki Cristina Barcelona" isn't quite on a par with Allen's best ruminations on love. like "Annie Hall" or "Manhattan" or "Hannah and Her Sisters" but it's close - and it's well worth a look. Rebecca Hall and Scarlett Johansson play two young friends summering in Barcelona, with entirely different ideas about love. who become romantically entanoled with a bohemian Spanish artist (Javier Bardem) – who hasn't entirely cut his ties with his brilliant, talented, beautiful and violently cuckoo ex-wife (Penelope Cruz). It's an impressively complicated love story that could have been played, with a slight shift of emphasis, as a particularly racy bedroom farce. But Allen isn't really interested in laughs here. "Some developers are report-ing higher cancellations by in-vestors who are no longer ng inglet curchatoris y in-vestors who are no longer motivated by price apprecia-tion." Lissner said. "Overall, buildings with significant in-vestor sales or buildings which are very generic tend to be at greater risk of contract fallout than buildings with special lo-cation or view amenities." The issue of contract cancel-lations is influencing all price points, and it is not just a first-time homebuyer issue, accord-ing to Appraisal Research. Nickel-and-diming car customers is getting out of hand **BY AL VINIKOUR** SearchChicago-Autos Contributor Since I generally review a different car every week, I get the opportunity to peruse a lot of Monroney labels. (For those from rural Vermont, Monroney labels are the price sheets you have to scrape off the rear door window when you purchase a new vehicle.)

Lately, I've witnessed a phenomenon that I do not care for whatsoever. A lot of manufacturers are listing charges for such items as "paint." You heard me right – paint. A few weeks ago I reviewed a Mercedes-Benz

CLK500 coupe. It was a truly marvelous vehicle and I was delighted to have driven it. It certainly wasn't a cheap ride - bottom-lining at \$57,680. However, of that total, \$670 was charged for "pewter silver" paint.

Let's think about this for a minute. Someone is paying about \$60,000 for a vehicle. If you deduct the \$670 cost of the paint and bury it in the cost of the vehicle, you'd still be paying close to \$60,000. However, you'd have the satisfaction of thinking you didn't pay an 8 percent premium for a paint job.

In 1965, I purchased a Ford Galaxie 500 twodoor hardtop. I didn't have any options except whitewall tires and an extra charge of \$38 for "poppy red" paint. Poppy red was a Mustang color and only available on the Galaxie for a premium. I don't have a problem with that. What l really think approaches the outskirts of "tacky city" is when manufacturers charge extra for an available color.

If you chose to accept your vehicle without any paint, would the car company credit you for the amount of money you would have had to pay if you'd had the car painted? This could set off a veritable chain reaction of savings. What if you wanted to buy this Mercedes

CLK500, but you were on a restricted budget? If you were to save thousands of dollars by accepting the vehicle without external paint and no interior, you could go to Pep Boys, buy a few cans of your own choice of spray paint, purchase a couple of aftermarket canvas-back seats and, voila, you'd own a custom-built Mercedes-Benz.

I don't see any difference in this concept and one where you have to overtly pay a manufacturer extra for paint. But maybe that's just me. After all, I was born and raised in the flatlands of Indiana and was a graduate of the University of Ben and Shirley (my parents, two of the most fiscally irresponsible people who ever lived).

Other examples of "customer gouging" are

extra charges for floor mats and cargo nets. Collectively they equal a few hundred dollars maximum. It is beyond my comprehension why manufacturers choose to break out these figures and list them separately

Are they afraid prospective buyers will walk into a dealership and negate a purchase because they can't buy a vehicle devoid of floor mats? If this is your customer's idea of a "dream vehicle," you, Mr. Car Dealer, are demographically pathetic. And a flag should be flown at half-staff for you too, Mr. Automotive Manufacturer, for encouraging a soup-kitchen mentality for your dealer network.


Floor mats and paint should be a given. You wouldn't expect to reduce the cost of your luxury vehicle by eliminating the power windows or the remote-control outside rearview mirrors. I don't see those costs listed separately on a Monroney

If it's so important to list things like floor mats separately on the Monroney label, why are some salesmen so philanthropic that they'd "throw in" the cost of them to "clinch the deal?" It's almost as absurd as trying to sell you an upgraded audio system and "throwing in the knobs courtesy of the dealership" if it means the customer would take the bigger unit. Semantics might be an acceptable word for a Scrabble game but it has no place in credible negotiations.

I have enough voices in my head without bringing up the subject of "vehicle delivery charges." Why would you have to pay the better part of \$1,000 to have your vehicle delivered from a plant you could walk to, but yet spend the same money for a vehicle to come all the way from Japan?

I was not raised by wolves, but I was raised by people who had the philosophy that "perception is reality." When I see a vehicle manufacturer who gives the impression that the \$60,000 I'm spending for his product isn't quite enough, that it can get another \$670 from me by charging extra for paint, it's time for me to save my hard-earned money and consider public transportation. Most of the time you don't even have to pay extra for a transfer

High gas prices drive down traffic fatalities

WASHINGTON - Roll back the clock to 1961: Over the previous 10 months, monthly fatalities John F. Kennedy was inaugurated president. The Peace Corps was founded. The Dow Jones industrials hit 734. Gasoline reached 31 cents a gallon.

And the number of people killed in U.S. traffic accidents that year topped 36,200. This year, gasoline climbed to more than \$4

one study - appears headed to the lowest levels since Kennedy moved into the White House.

The number is being pulled down by a change in Americans' driving habits, which is fueled largely by record-high gasoline prices, according to the Transportation Research Institute at the University of Michigan.

The institute's study, which covers 12 months ending in April, found that as gas prices rose, driving and fatalities declined. The surprise, said professor Michael Sivak, author of the study, was the huge decline in fatalities in March and April as gasoline prices surged higher than \$3.20 a gallon.

declined an average of 4.2 percent compared to the previous year. Then, Sivak's data shows, fatalities dropped 22.1 percent in March and 17.9 percent in April of this year.

The declines found by Sivak suggest that motorists reached what he calls a "tipping point" and have begun significantly changing their bea gallon, and the traffic death toll - according to havior - altering not only how much they drive, but where, when and how they drive. Sivak said early data for May and June show similar trends.

If the pattern continues for the rest of this year, it would lead to "an unheard of improvement" in motor vehicle fatalities, said Siyak, who used data from the National Safety Council, National Center for Health Statistics and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Sivak predicts that highway deaths this year will drop below 37,000 for the first time since 1961 if the March and April trends continue.



These green SUVs don't sacrifice flexibility, functionality



hrysler LLC is late to the hybrid game, but during a recent media preview the American automaker clearly stated that it thinks it's introducing the right vehicles at the right time.

The all-new 2009 Dodge Durango Hybrid and Chrysler Aspen Hybrid are no-compromises SUVs, according to Bob Feldmaier, chief engineer for Aspen/Durago/Dakota.

"If you buy one of these vehicles," he said, "this is what you'd have to give up: Nothing."

While the market for a full-size SUV is diminishing because of the current spike in gas prices, there always will be those who need the flexibility and functionality of a vehicle that can fit eight passengers and tow trailers and boats. Chrysler would like to see those consumers turn to the Aspen or Durango hybrids.

Though the Aspen and Durango have different images, the pricing on both hybrids is surprisingly similar. The only configuration available for the 2009 model year is the four-wheel drive Limited model equipped with the 5.7-liter Hemi. Yet the Durango has a base price of \$45,340, and the Aspen has a base price of \$45,570.

Obviously, badging, interior finishes and exterior façade will be specific to each vehicle, but in terms of fit-and-finish and luxury amenities, I didn't notice any major differences. Plus, the only options available on either vehicle are the rear DVD entertainment system (\$1,400), the trailer tow package (\$460) and the sunroof (\$850). Premium standards on both vehicles include leather seating surfaces, heated front seats, side-curtain airbags for all three rows, navigation and a power lift gate.

So, for the purposes of the preview, my driving partner and I chose the Dodge Durango for the test drive figuring that Durango and Aspen could be used relatively interchangeably.

With its entry into the hybrid world, Chrysler partnered with General Motors, Mercedes-Benz and the BMW Group to create the two-mode, full-hybrid system in the Durango and Aspen. The "two mode" refers to the low- and highspeed electric continuously variable transmission modes, which allow the electric motors to kick in both while driving in stop-and-go situations and at highway cruising speeds.

As full hybrids, both the Durango and Aspen will operate in the full range of power from electric only to gasoline only. With gentle acceleration and speeds up to about 30 mph, the electric motor carries the weight of motivation. But as

soon as you add in hard acceleration, the gasolin engine kicks in immediately.


The 5.7-liter, V-8 Hemi engine in the hybrids delivers 345 horsepower and 380 pounds to feet of torque and if you throw in the 300-volt battery, total horsepower output increases to 385 horsepower. Maximum towing capacity is 6,000 pounds.

Driving the Durango Hybrid, I often forgot about the sheer size of the vehicle because the acceleration was virtually instantaneous and the interior quietness was surprising.

Fuel economy for the hybrids is estimated to be 18 miles per gallon in the city and 19 on the highway. This may not seem like a big deal, but consider that in addition to seating eight, the Durango and Aspen weigh more than 5,500 pounds, only come as four-wheel drive models and have 20.1 cubic feet of cargo volume behind the thirdrow seats. Plus, the regular gasoline models have city/highway fuel estimates of 13/18 miles per gallon. This translates to an overall fuel economy improvement of about 25 percent and Chrysler points out that these hybrids will reduce fuel consumption by several hundreds of gallons of gasoline per year.

The ride in the Durango Hybrid was surprisingly comfortable for such a large vehicle. I was able to get a good driving position that put me far enough away from the steering wheel, close enough to the pedals and high enough to see over the front end of the vehicle.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention the Chevrolet Tahoe and GMC Yukon hybrids, the GM vehicles that resulted from the GM-Chrysler-Mercedes-BMW partnership. The Tahoe and Yukon hybrids are similarly equipped with plush amenities, but the base price flies up past \$50,000,



creating a \$7,000 difference in pricing between the GM and Chrysler counterparts. All of these full-size hybrids weigh more than 5,500 pounds, can tow up to 6,000 pounds, can seat eight and have four-wheel drive models.

But excluding price, there are other differences of note. The GM vehicles offer two-wheel drive models in addition to the four-wheel drive model and gas mileage is better in the Yukon and Tahoe with 20/20 miles per gallon ratings in the four-wheel drive model. The two-wheel drive models get even better fuel economy with 21/22 miles per gallon and they can tow up to 6,200 pounds. On the other hand, the Chrysler models offer more horsepower, more torque and more cargo volume behind the third-row seat.

The Durango and Aspen are set to enter the market this fall and all I have to say is: Hurray! I think the full-size utility market is where hybrid technology is needed the most. And, frankly, I'm surprised Toyota hasn't traveled this way yet. However, I have to admit that I'm glad for the Americans that they're traversing this path first - and they're coming up with some darn good products in the process.







Novelist who knits way into readers' hearts visits Niles


A crowd of waiting women clutching romance novels began to stir and titter as the announcement came over the intercom: "Debbie is in the building."

The long line of literary ladies had gathered at the Niles Public Library Aug 20 to meet best-selling author Debbie Macomber, whose romance novels and contemporary women's fiction have sold more than 60 million copies worldwide. She reached a new career milestone in September 2007 when her book, "74 Seaside Avenue" scored No. 1 on The New York Times, USA Today, Publishers Weekly and Bookscan bestseller lists.

Macomber, a Washington native, was in town to speak at the STITCHES knitting convention in Schaumburg and had come to Niles to sign some books for her fans and have a question and answer session over tea.

"I just love reading her;" said Karen Fish-Schurder: a Macomber fan from Vernon Hills, "I love all the characters, all the personalities. It's about friendships and women who help one another."

"I didn't learn to read

until l was in fifth grade," she said. "Learning to knit gave me self-esteem. I struggled all throughout school. I was dyslexic, but we didn't have a word for it back then. I just thought I was dumb."


But knitting gave Macomber an emotional out-

Hood

When Palatine's Lee Bretl read the directions for his new grill and smoker, he learned he'd soon go beyond run-ofthe-mill charcoal.

He'd join a growing number of outdoor cooks using hardwoods to add a smoky complexity to his grilled fare. And, he added, it was a snap,

"All you do is soak them for an hour, and throw them on there," said the hardwood cooking convert.


To Chef Jamie Purviance, the idea of adding woods to grilling is old as outdoor grilling itself, and it has stuck around for good reason, he said. "Wood chips and

chunks bring a depth of flavor and aroma to grilled foods that really hearken back to the origins of this way of cooking. In the beginning people realized that the depth wood can give the food, and even today that depth can fill in flavor gaps. If there is food that

Chips and chunks will deepen the flavors of grilled foods

chicken breast, or a fish fillet with not much flavor. the wood can fill in the gaps and give the food a really nice flavor."

Purviance, the author of three best-selling cookbooks. Weber's Art of the Grill, Weber's Real Grilling, and Weber's Charcoal Grilling: the art of cooking with live fire, offered that one of the first steps in using woodchips or wood chunks is choosing a wood for your cooking.

Variety of aromas

Some woods, like mesquite and hickory, have a pungent, almost bitter quality. Other woods, like oak and maple, are more moderate in intensity. And fruit woods, like apple, cherry and pear, can add a subtle sweetness to foods.

Purviance suggests thinking of these qualities when pairing woods with food. "The classic pairing is pork and hickory. That goes back to the south and barbecue. For poultry I really like oak and maple, they are a little milder than hickory. For vegetables I like an even

more subtle wood, so l look to the fruit woods like apple, cherry or near"


But, he stressed, if you're cooking pork, and you can't find hickory at vour local store, it's not the end of the world.

"I don't want people to get the wrong idea and think there is a huge difference in flavors. It's not like comparing apples and oranges. It's more like comparing types of apples. They are always going to taste like wood, and they are always going to have that outdoor aroma. The differences are subtle."

More important, he said, is avoiding oversmoking. This, he said, is what happens when too much smoke is used and the taste and scent of the smoke overpower the food

"As a griller you can affect the intensity of the smoke. It doesn't always have to be the obvious barbecue kind of flavor, as I get deeper into this style of cooking. I'm learning to use the flavors in a more subtle way." he said.

The easiest way to control the amount of smoke is to control the

amount of wood that is used. He suggests using one or two handfuls of chips, rather than six or seven handfuls.

Also, he added, some newer grills have smoke boxes that allow the griller to control the amount of smoke that escapes the box.

Soaking chips for a half-hour to an hour is also important, he said. and will lead to the chips slowly smoking rather than burning up. Shaking excess water off soaked chips is also important. "You don't want to add a lot of water to a grill," he pointed out

For a first time wood chip user, he suggests a simple barbècue chicken cooked over charcoal. "I'd start with oak or hickory, those are the most available. Throw two handfuls into a bowl


with some water and let them soak for about an hour. When the charcoal is ready, take one handful and throw it into your coals. Take some bone in chicken pieces and cook the chicken, as you would over indirect heat. After about 15 minutes, add a second handful of chips. Cook the chicken as you would, for about and hour, and let it smoke away."

heat, warm the oil. Add the garlic, chile powder, and cumin Cook for 30 seconds, stirring occasionally. Add the remaining sauce ingredients, whisk them together, and allow the sauce to simmer for about 5 minutes.

Remove the thin membrane from the back of each rack of ribs. Allow the ribs to stand at room temperature for 20 to 30 minutes before grilling.

To make the rub: In a small bowl, mix the rub ingredients. Season the ribs all over with the rub, pressing the spices into the meat.

Drain the mesquite chips and toss them onto the burning coals or into the smoking box of

a gas grill. Grill the ribs over indirect low heat (grill temperature should be about 300 degrees) until the meat is very tender and has shrunk back from the ends of the bones, 1-1/2to 2 hours. About 15 minutes before the ribs are done. start brushing occasionally with the sauce on both sides.

Transfer the ribs to a baking sheet and tightly cover with aluminum foil. Let rest for 30 minutes before serving. Serve warm.
